Secretary's Report: The awards banquet and officer induction ceremony is scheduled for September 24, 2025. All officer pins and awards have been ordered and should arrive in time for the ceremony. There were no corrections to the minutes and they were approved as printed in the Smoke Signal. Dues notices for the coming year will be handed out at the Sept. 3rd meeting and are due to the treasurer by Oct. 1, 2025. The dues will be the same as last year. \$155 payable to Blackhawk Golden K.

Treasurer's Report: The administrative checking account was up about \$600. The expenditures for golf and speaker gifts were offset by Hamish Martin's donation to the club and some belated mid-year appeal gifts. The service checking account was down about \$4000 due to annual donations to the Kiwanis Children's Fund, the District Foundation, Camp Wawbeek and the Janesville Parks. Paul Neitzel made a motion to approve the treasurer's report and was seconded by Tom Neumann and approved.

Membership Committee Plans: The Lions 2025 Chicken Roast for publicity and membership leads is set for September 6th and the Senior Fair is September 12th.


NEW BUSINESS

Comparing 2025 charity budget to actual expenditures: The service account had a deficit of \$2,358 and the administrative account had a surplus of \$2,510. After subtracting the total expenses from total income for the 2025 fiscal year, the club ended up with a surplus of \$152. The surplus was due to unexpectedly low weekly meeting expenses but the deficit in the service account will need to be addressed by the board when reviewing the charities that we wish to continue to support and any proposals for additional charities. Dollar amounts may have to be adjusted.

Fundraising: The board discussed the possible creation of a committee to create a list of potential fundraiser events. In addition to the winter Truck on Ice project, the board would like to have a summer event to raise more funds for charitable causes.

Tree Sale: The board agreed to support the tree sale for another year in the hope that the past year of just breaking even was an anomaly or off year and that the tree sale returns to profitability. Motion to adjourn at 9:15 a.m.



via the Kiwanis. In 1935 the Kiwanis had their first nationwide broadcast of their national convention with their message of service and fellowship.






